KIST School Dual Degree Program

• As a leading research oriented Academy in science and technology, KIST School aims to provide real research and development experience to those students from partner universities through intensive graduate level education, and to bring them up as competent engineers and scientists. After completion of the program, the degree will be conferred from partner universities and the Diploma will be conferred from KIST School.

Guidelines for the 2020 Fall

Eligibility

- Applicants, who have fulfilled their coursework requirements from Partner University with a **cumulative GPA of at least 4.0 out of 5.0**, will be entitled to enroll in the equivalent M.S. or Ph.D. degree program at KIST School.
- The required language is English. Students, who have a **TOEFL score of CBT 213 or higher or other equivalent scores** such as IELTS or TOEIC, will be considered qualified.

Period

- Spring semester begins in March(admission process starts in previous Sep.), and Fall semester begins in September(admission process starts in Mar.),.
- Students should study at KIST for at least one year for an M.S. or M.E. degree and two years for a Ph.D. degree.

TO : Maximum 5 students at every semester from every partner university

Full Scholarship

- Tuition and registration costs are covered by KIST.
- The highest level of financial support in Korea is provided to help students focus on their study and research. Monthly stipends of 1,100~1,600 USD for Master students and 1,500~2,100 USD for Ph.D. students

List of Required Documents

Scanned version of all required documents must submitted by application deadline to e-admission system of KIST School. After announcement of successful candidates, Original version of all required documents must submitted to KIST School Secretariat on the first day of internship.

- For all applicants:
 - Application Form (Form is on the e-admission system)
 - Essay (Form is on the e-admission system)
 - Certificate of (Expected) Bachelor's Degree
 - Bachelor's Degree Transcript in English: Transfer students must submit all university transcripts acquired both pre- and post-transfer.
 - Official English Score (if available).
 - Copy of Passport
 - Certificate of Career / Employment (if available).
- For Master applicants:
 - Certificate of (Expected) Master's Degree
 - Master's Degree Transcript in English: Transfer students are required to submit all university transcripts, both pre- and post-transfer.
 - Master's Degree Thesis: Only the titles of papers and abstracts should be submitted. If, in accordance with university regulations or other relevant laws, you obtained a degree without having to write a thesis, you must submit the necessary documentation.
 - Research Achievements (if available): Publications including published papers, papers presented at academic conferences, and patents

* All test scores should be dated within 2 years of the application deadline. During the internship, KIST School supports fee of TOEIC tests.

Note

- After submitting the application, if there is a change in academic status like expulsion and withdraw and student do not notify his or her changed status to KIST School secretariat, KIST School can cancel the admission or terminate internship.
- If all required documents would not be submitted, then will be considered to fail at the formal examination in the first selection.
- All application documents should be written in English. Documents not written in English must be accompanied by certified translations (or documents notarized at embassy).
